DEARBORN. March 23, 2020 – In response to Governor Whitmer's Stay at Home, Stay Safe Order, Friends for Animals of Metro Detroit (FAMD) will be adjusting our operations to keep our staff, volunteers and the community safe, while ensuring animal care does not suffer.

- At this time, we will not be accepting any owner surrenders, unless it is an emergency situation, and each situation which will be addressed on a case by case basis, by appointment only.
- All adoptions will be by appointment only, as will any foster meetings.
- Our Feed Fido pet food pantry program will continue, by appointment only.
- Volunteers can continue to provide help if scheduled to do so. Please follow CDC recommendations and do not volunteer if you are feeling ill or have been in contact with someone who is sick.
- We will not be accepting any donated items at this time.
