Letter from Our Board Chair

Dear FAMD Supporters,

While we navigate our way through an incredibly challenging COVID-19 environment, it is a pleasure to reflect upon 2019 and all of the accomplishments Elaine and her team delivered with the support of our terrific volunteers, board of directors, and community partners. 2019 was another successful year in our history where we continued to focus on finding homes for our animals and improving the lives of those who live in the communities in which we serve. Some 2019 highlights:

- Animal Adoption and Education Center High-quality care and
 adoption services. We celebrated our first anniversary in our new AAEC.
 The animals are much healthier and certainly happier in their new environment where they have more spacious "apartments", natural light, clean air, and an outdoor space.
- Saving all adoptable animals. For the 20th consecutive year, we saved 100% of all adoptable animals, with 2,008 new homes being enhanced through adoptions, the highest in our history. This is a cornerstone value of our organization and a true differentiator versus other animal welfare organizations.
- **Volunteers.** Our volunteers are the heart of our organization. They enable us to ensure the animals receive the best care and love. In 2019, 289 volunteers spent 14,440 hours caring for the animals, implementing our programs and events.
- Delivering innovative outreach and education programs.
 - ♥ Read to Rover -Children can improve their reading skills by reading to a dog at the adoption center. The kids are in a comfortable and non-judgmental environment and the dogs get much-needed love and attention. In 2019, we had 42 children participate in the program.
 - ♥ **Veteran Pet Adoption Program** Retired or active military are eligible for reduced adoption fees. In 2019, we helped 11 veterans find their new best friends.
 - ♥ Feed Fido In 2019 we provided families in need with 6,400 pounds of food. This ensured that families experiencing financial challenges were able to keep their beloved pets in their homes, where they belong.
 - ♥ Blue Star Service Dogs Shelter dogs are paired with vetted prisoners at the Thumb Correctional Facility in Lapeer, Michigan to be trained as support dogs for veterans and first responders. The benefits of this program are two-fold: better trained and socialized dogs and inmates who learn and practice empathy and responsibility.
 - ♥ Hope's Heroes. This program funds medical and surgical expenses for animals in our care with extensive health issues (i.e. heartworm treatments) or injuries. In 2019 we treated 137 animals through this program.
 - ♥ **Doggy Day Out.** This program, which began in 2019, provided outside adventures for many of our dogs. These excursions included shopping trips to Lowes, JoAnn Fabrics, and a fan-favorite Starbucks for "Puppacinos." Some of our dogs enjoyed a day of snuggling on the couch at a volunteer's home. We even had a dog adopted as a result of this program.

Planning for the future. While we continue to find our way through the COIVD-19 pandemic, 2020 is going to be a year of significant change at Friends for Animals of Metro Detroit.

• After 24 years, Elaine Greene will retire as our Executive Director on July 1. Elaine has been the foundation of our organization and the strongest of advocates for our animals. She has overseen our growth from a small Dearborn-based group of passionate animal lovers to one of Southeast Michigan's largest and most respected animal shelter and community outreach organizations. We are so grateful to Elaine for her incredible work and commitment to FAMD. Elaine's passion for FAMD remains strong, and she now serves as a member of the board of directors. Succeeding Elaine is Kim Cross, who joined us in 2018 as the Development and Marketing Director. We are truly fortunate to have an outstanding and experienced leader to assume the role of FAMD's CEO and President. Kim is an experienced senior leader in both the corporate and non-profit sectors, including Merrill Lynch and Goldman Sachs, as well as her own firm,

Philanthropy Services LLC. She also worked for Leader Dogs for the Blind and Wayne State University. Under Kim's leadership, FAMD has a completely new marketing and branding strategy as well as enhanced community outreach and fundraising programs.

• We are also hard at work to fundraise for Phase 2 of the Animal Adoption and Education Center capital campaign project to bring all of our services under one roof. Phase 2 of the project will cost \$5.1 million, and include the animal intake and medical evaluation and treatment operations, as well as expanding our education and outreach programs. To date, we have raised or have pledges totaling \$1.6 million. The Fundraising Committee is working every day to get this project completed as soon as possible so we can all come home.

FAMD continues to grow and change to meet the increasing needs in our community for excellent animal care and educational programs. The staff, volunteers and board are so thankful to our donors and supporters – we could not do it without you! We are successful as an organization because our entire community comes together by supporting our events, capital campaign, volunteering, fostering, and, of course, adopting our animals.

Every year, our dedicated staff and volunteers love and care for thousands of animals who find refuge at our shelter - including those who are lost, abused, abandoned, injured or ill. All animals adopted from FAMD are vaccinated, spayed or neutered, and microchipped for identification.

Fundraising Events

Mutt Strut "Walk and 5K Run"

In 2019 we held the 14th annual Mutt Strut, with Dearborn Family Pet Care returning as the presenting sponsor. For the third year in a row, the event included a dog-friendly 5K that took runners through the scenic Gateway Trail and onto the University of Michigan campus. After the 5K and the shorter, leisurely strut through downtown Dearborn, FAMD supporters and their dogs spent the afternoon at Ford Field Park visiting pet-themed vendors, entering games & contests, and running the lure course. While not only being a fun day out for dogs and their humans, the event raised over \$90,000 to support FAMD and our programs! ♥

"Fore the Animals" Golf Invitational

On July 22, 2019, a sold out crowd of 145 golfers spent the day at the Dearborn Country Club golfing "fore" the animals of FAMD. The weather cooperated nicely, and the blue skies provided the perfect backdrop for a day of golf, food, fun and friends. The on-course games, tin can raffle and putting contest returned, which gave the golfers an extra chance to win some themed prizes. While the storms that had rolled through the area the weekend prior made things challenging - the club had no power and we were not allowed in the clubhouse - everyone came together to raise over \$50,000 to support FAMD and our programs. ♥





Black Tie and Tails Gala

Building on our "home" theme, which has been incorporated into the past two galas, the theme of the 19th annual Black Tie and Tails was "Home is a Four- Letter Word." This theme celebrated both the first year anniversary in our new Animal Adoption and Education Center, and the love an animal receives when they are adopted into their forever home. As in previous years, the gala was held at the Dearborn Inn, and generously presented by MaryAnn Wright and Bob Sayles. The night included a program celebrating the work of Friends, live and silent auctions, music by the Rick Lieder Band, dancing, and the Adoptable Pet Parade - a favorite of the attendees. Thanks to our wonderful supporters, the event raised over \$150,000 to care for the animals who come through our organization!

Big Heart Winner - Dr. Good

Our 2019 Big Heart Award winner was Dr. Cheryl Good, DVM. This award is given to recognize the dedication and compassion of an individual who unselfishly gives their time and talent to saving and providing sanctuary to animals. When Friends was formed in 1993, Dr. Good was one of the original members. Since that time, she has been both on the board, and served as the organization's medical director for many years, going above and beyond to help animals in need. Dr. Good shared. "I have been involved with Friends for Animals of Metro Detroit for over 25 years. In that time, I helped to change the culture and improve the conditions for the homeless pets of Dearborn. I wholeheartedly continue to support the FAMD vision and mission, because by adopting from them you will definitely get back more than what's humanly possible!" ♥

While not hosted by FAMD, there were three major third-party events held in 2019 that benefited our organization and the animals we care for. We are honored to be one of three organizations chosen to receive funding from Michigan Animal Welfare Foundation's Fur Ball, held in April, and their Bowl 4 Animal Rescue, held in August. In 2019, between both of these events, FAMD received \$30,774. The Fur Ball, held at the Suburban Showplace Collection in Novi, is a gala event with dinner, auctions, and a program highlighting the work of FAMD and other local animal organizations. This year marked the 14th annual Bowl 4 Animal Rescue, a bowling event held at Country Lanes in Farmington Hills. On Columbus Day, longtime FAMD supporter Pat D'Ambrosio held his 6th annual famous Pat's Paw-sitively Pasta dinner at Park Place Catering. This pasta dinner raised over \$17,000 for FAMD. Pat used his family's secret recipe to cook wonderful sauce and meatballs, and offered both eat-in and to-go options so everyone could attend. \

Featured Programs - Read to Rover &

Doggy Day Out

Read to Rover

We began the Read to Rover program at FAMD in March 2019 to coincide with March is Reading Month. This program is open to children of all reading levels, and allows children to practice their reading skills by reading to a shelter animal. By doing so, the children gain confidence and improve their reading, while shelter animals are comforted and get some extra attention. Shelter animals make great reading buddies, as they are a non-judgmental audience

and allow children to become more comfortable reading aloud. During our first year of the program, we had 42 students who participated, many of whom returned for additional reading sessions!






In November of 2019, FAMD began our Doggy Day Out program which falls on the second and fourth Saturday of each month. This program allows community members to take a dog out of the shelter for the day. They can go on adventures outdoors, visit stores such as Lowes or JoAnn Fabrics, enjoy "Puppacinos" at Starbucks, or just head home for a day of movie watching and snuggling on the couch. In 2019, 21 dogs were able to spend time out of the

shelter and go on new adventures with the help of 16 volunteers

who were eager to take them. We even had one adoption that was a direct result of this program!










