

SEVERELY MATTED STRAY DOG BROUGHT TO FRIENDS FOR ANIMALS OF METRO DETROIT IN DEARBORN

Dearborn, MICH. 12, 5 2023 – On Friday, December 1, Dearborn Animal Control brought in a severely matted, soaking wet large dog, weighing about 90 lbs. He was immediately shaved down by the medical team at Friends for Animals, where he proved to be very calm and gentle. A chain collar was found, also matted in the fur. No microchip was found, so little is known about his history. He is heartworm positive.

"To be in the condition he was in, at his age, it would appear he probably has never been groomed before. He remained calm and tolerant throughout the entire process of shaving over 11 lbs. of heavy, wet and matted hair off of him. Watching his personality blossom afterwards has been amazing," said medical technician Tiffany Hamilton.

President and CEO Cory Keller continues, "unfortunately, this is not the first case of neglect Friends for Animals has seen this year. Luckily in Reggae's case, he was brought to us so we can provide him the necessary support and medical care to ensure he can get the second chance he deserves. We all love animals, as they provide so much love, and companionship, but they are a responsibility. They require proper food and water, a warm home to live in, and necessary medical care so they can remain healthy. Reggae, just like other dogs we have seen this year, did not need to suffer like this. There are many resources in the community and online that can help pet owners if they have fallen on hard times.
