OUR ANIMALS

- Overall Intake: 2,482
 - 758 dogs/1,643 cats/81 domestic animals and wildlife
- Overall placement rate: 85%
- Before adoption, all animals have age-appropriate vaccines, are spayed, or neutered, and microchipped with registration.

- Double compartment housing for all animals/separate areas for dogs and cats/natural light
- Meet-and-greet rooms

NATIONAL STATISTICS


- Estimated national annual spending on pets: \$150 billion
- Households owning pets:66 % (Source: APPA)
 - · Households with cats: 40 million
 - · Households with dogs: 58 million
- Annual shelter statistics for cats and dogs (Source: ASPCA):
 - Intake: 6.3 million
 - Intake of purebred dogs: 25%
- Approximately 40 % of dogs and 43% of cats are adopted from shelters (APPA)

VOLUNTEERS

- 348 registered volunteers
- 23,445 hours donated (equivalent value of over \$785,173 in wages)
- 666 foster animals cared for with 16,972 hours donated (1 hr/animal/day)
- Student volunteer program: One of the few sheltering organizations to accept kids under age 16
- Internships: Ongoing opportunities for local partnering schools.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- We are a training and resource site for community groups and individuals, including:
 - Read to Rover children's reading support program
 - Mixter Institute for Transition for young adults with autism
 - Community service opportunities for court, school and scouting requirements.
 - Service projects for businesses, churches, senior facilities or community groups.
 - Provide practical experience for veterinary technician students through V.I.P.
 - Veteran Adoption programs —discounted adoptions.
 - Doggy Day Out- opportunities to host a dog for a day.
 - · Foster to Adopt- test run the match before adopting.

SUPPORTER DEMOGRAPHICS

- 55% of volunteers, 67% of donors, and 72% of adopters are from outside of Dearborn
- 8,094 people visited our shelter in 2024
